Conducting a Review

When you conduct a Level of Care review, you use InterQual® Criteria that is organized in decision-tree format. InterQual products that use this format include the following:

- LOC: Acute Adult
- LOC: Acute Pediatric
- LOC: Long-Term Acute Care
- LOC: Inpatient Rehabilitation
- LOC Subacute/SNF
- BH: Adult and Geriatric Psychiatry
- BH: Child and Adolescent Psychiatry
- BH: Substance Use Disorders
- CP: Specialty Referral
- Retrospective Monitoring

❗ **Important:** If you are conducting a review for **LOC: Home Care Q&A, LOC: Outpatient Rehabilitation & Chiropractic** or **BH: Behavioral Health Services**, use the *InterQual® Conducting a Prior-Auth Review job aid*.

1. Find and select a subset using one or a combination of these methods:
 - Select a product and category. If you have access to criteria from multiple years, select a version.
 - Enter keywords (for example, words found in the subset name).
 - Enter medical codes (for example, ICD codes).
2. If you searched by keywords or medical codes, click **FIND SUBSETS**.
When the results appear, the Results count indicates the number of subsets that match the search criteria.
3. Click a subset name to select it.
The subset notes appear.
4. If there is more than one version of the subset available, select a subset version.

5. Read the subset notes to get information about the subset. You can also access select supporting Clinical Reference resources (for example, the Review Process or drug list) from the Subset Notes page.

① Note: If necessary, at any time, you can clear your subset selection by clicking CLEAR ALL or clicking CHANGE SUBSET to select a different subset.

6. Click Book View.

Instruction:

While there are a variety of medical conditions that can lead to troponin elevation, this criteria intends to include a patient with positive troponins due to Acute Coronary Syndrome (ACS). The patient with elevated troponins arising from demand ischemia should be reviewed in the respective subset that corresponds to the source of their demand (e.g., Infection: Sepsis, Infection: Pneumonia, Heart failure, Acute kidney injury, Gastrointestinal (GI) bleeding, Anemia)

Introduction:



Acute coronary syndrome (ACS) refers to a spectrum of conditions that are associated with an abrupt reduction in blood flow to the heart. Conditions include:

- Unstable angina (UA)
- Non-ST-segment elevation myocardial infarction (NSTEMI)

7. Depending on the subset you selected, do the following:
 - **Level of Care: Acute Adult and Pediatric**—Select an Episode Day from the list.
 - **Level of Care: Long Term Acute Care and Inpatient Rehabilitation**—Select a review type (that is, Preadmission, Admission, Continued Stay, or Discharge).
 - **Subacute and Skilled Nursing**—Select a review type (that is Preadmission, Admission, Week 1, Continued Stay, Week 2-4, or Discharge Screens). For some subsets, select Initial Review, Ongoing, Review, or Discharge Review.
 - **Behavioral Health**—Select a level of care and then choose the appropriate Episode Day or Week.
 - **Care Planning: Specialty Referral**—Select an indication from the list.

8. Expand the decision tree as follows:

- Click a plus sign  to expand a section of the decision tree and click a minus sign  to collapse it.
- Click Expand All to expand all criteria in the decision tree and click Collapse All to collapse it.

- Use the vertical scroll bar to see all the criteria.

9. View any notes associated with the criteria by clicking the appropriate note icon:

- **Informational Note**  —Informational notes provide reminders of the best clinical practice, new clinical knowledge, procedural information, explanations of criteria rationale, and current literature references.
- **Quality Indicator Note**  —Indicates that quality indicator data exists for this condition.
- **Transition Plan Note**  —Often indicates that the patient might be at a higher risk for readmission and could benefit from comprehensive discharge planning. If you select a criteria point that has a Transition Plan note, Change Healthcare recommends that you complete a transition plan.
- **Note (Red)**  —Mandatory notes are associated with an indication or criteria point and provide important information that you must read while conducting a review.
- **Care Management Note**  —Care Management notes provide information that helps to drive quality care and ensure that the patient is progressing along the continuum of care.
- **CMS Two-Midnight Rule Note**  — Provides instructions for the Two-Midnight rule.

10. When you finish viewing criteria, do any of the following:

- Click Change Subset to view criteria for a different subset.
- Click Previous to return to the Subset Overview screen.

- Click Menu to exit the workflow and then, optionally, select an option from the navigation pane.

Viewing the Clinical Reference

The Clinical Reference provides important information about InterQual® Criteria and how to conduct reviews.

You can use the Clinical Reference while you conduct a review, or as a resource for clinical information. If your organization has access to InterQual Criteria from previous years, then the appropriate historical versions of the Clinical Reference are also available.

Note: You can also access select Clinical Reference resources (for example, the Review Process) directly from the Subset Notes screen.

View the Clinical Reference as follows:

1. On the main (Select Subset) screen, select a criteria product and version.

The Clinical Reference button is enabled.

2. Click **CLINICAL REFERENCE**.

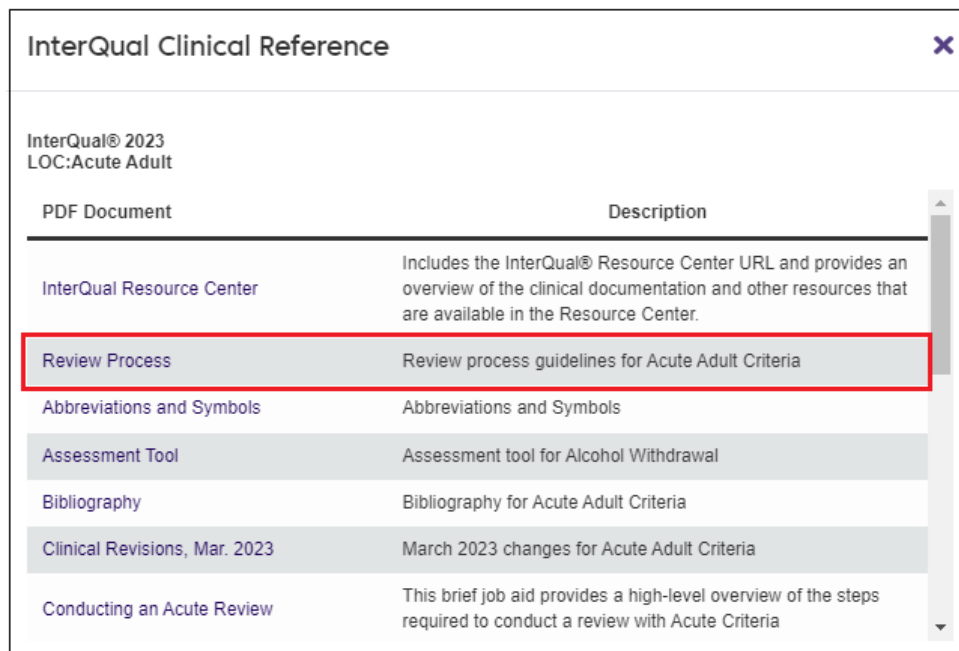
A list of resources is displayed (for example, criteria bibliographies, Review Process, and other supporting materials).

3. Click a resource name to view it.

4. If the resource is a PDF, depending on the options available, click Open or click

5. Use the controls in the PDF to save and/or print a document.



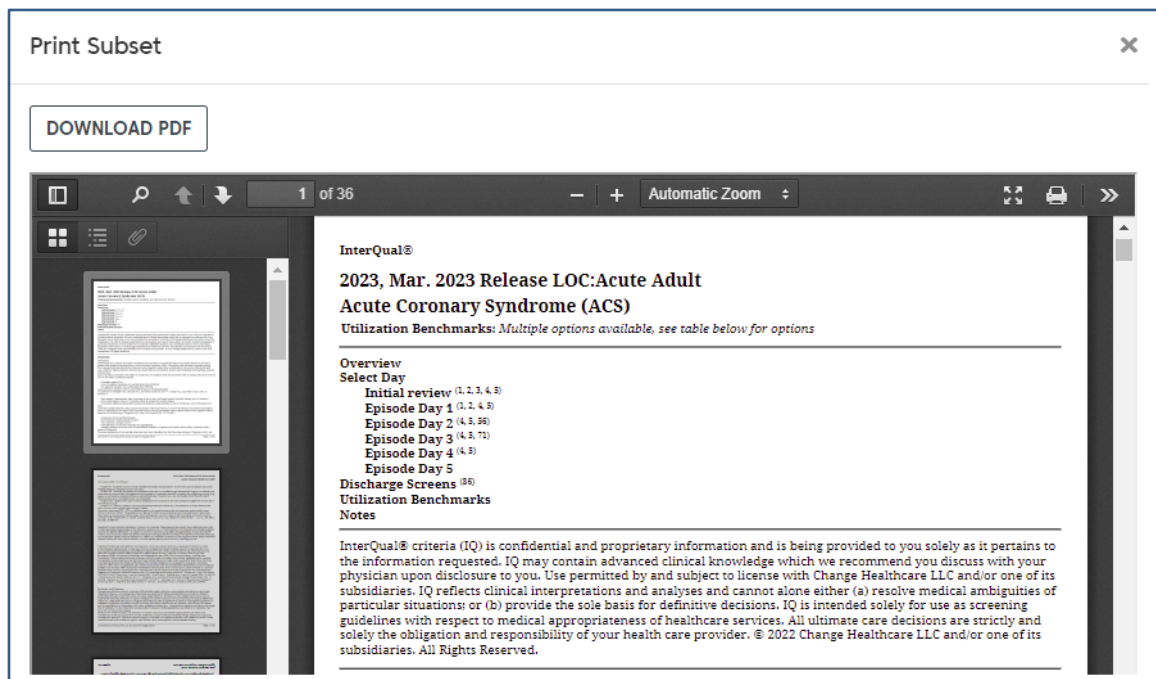
