

Appropriate Antibiotic Use

Join us in observing U.S. Antibiotic Awareness Week is from November 18-24. This week focuses on the critical need for prudent antibiotic use to combat resistance and ensure effective treatments for future generations.

For the Measurement Year (MY) 2023, Neighborhood's Healthcare Effectiveness Data Information Set (HEDIS) Medicaid rate for **Avoidance of Antibiotic Treatment for Acute Bronchitis/Bronchiolitis** was 50.98%. Despite efforts, this figure reveals that antibiotics are often prescribed when they may not be necessary, not reaching our target rate.

How You Can Help

- 1. **Prescribe Wisely:** Antibiotics should be reserved for cases where they are clearly indicated. Many respiratory conditions like acute bronchitis are primarily viral and do not benefit from antibiotic treatment.
- 2. **Testing and Documentation:** Use antibiotics for sore throats only after a positive Strep result, and ensure accurate documentation in the patient's medical records.
- 3. **Highlight Risks:** Discuss with patients the potential risks associated with antibiotic use, such as allergic reactions, the development of C. difficile infections, and the increase in antibiotic-resistant bacteria.
